1. The RYA Ambition:

2. Objectives of the EYC Policy

- To make boating an activity that is genuinely open to anyone who wishes to take part.
- To provide the framework for everyone to enjoy the sport, in whatever capacity and to whatever level the individual desires.
- To ensure that the training schemes are accessible to all, including those who have been under-represented in the past.
- To ensure that Club members treat each other and visitors to the Club with respect.

3. EYC Club Rules

Membership of the Club shall be open to all persons irrespective of ethnicity, nationality, sexual orientation religion or beliefs; or of age, sex or disability except as a necessary consequence of the requirement of boating as a particular sport.
